

Gjissaf 1<sup>st</sup> April 1831.

Honorable Sit,

I have been favoured with your kind letter of the 27<sup>th</sup> ult. and am sorry to find that you should have been led to suppose that I had signed the Petition against the proposed Rail Road; the report has probably been raised by some person disposed to injure me, but I beg to assure you that I have declined, though frequently solicited, to sign the Petition, and I have no doubt but that Lord Newborough and yourself will, in time, be convinced of my having done so.

A Subscription has been entered into in this village towards defraying the expence of opposing the Rail Road Bill in Parliament, and I have been requested to contribute, but this I also refused to do, having made up my mind not to interfere with this business, either for or against it, and by so doing, I hope I shall not offend you or my neighbours.

I called yesterday upon David Jones the Quarry  
Agent respecting the Slabs, when he told me that  
they are all ready, but that some of them are of such  
a great length they will have to make a frame on  
purpose to carry them down to Postmadoe, where  
they will be ready for the Puffheli Boat the next  
Spring Tide.
